



Aerospace Engineering Master's degree programme

General Information

Assessment of applications and admission to the Master's Programme in Aerospace Engineering is conducted on a rolling basis

All applications must be submitted online, including necessary documentation. together with the required documentation. Original documents must be provided upon request.

Applicants who require a visa to study in Austria are advised to begin preparing the necessary documents (including legalization, if applicable) for the Austrian consular service as soon as they are notified that their application has been received and is under review. Please note that visa processing can take approximately 3 to 15 months. Applicants are solely responsible for their visa application; the university cannot intervene in this process. We therefore strongly recommend applying as early as possible to allow sufficient time for visa procedures.

The University of Applied Sciences Wiener Neustadt (FHWN) requires students to be present from the first day of the semester. No exceptions can be made for applicants who have not received their visa in time.

Class attendance is required and mandatory under the FHWN teaching model. Master's students must be in Wiener Neustadt on the official start date of the programme (mid-September, at the time of matriculation). Late arrivals may result in denial of admission to the programme.

Applications for the academic year beginning September 2026 can be submitted from September 2025.

Who is eligible to be admitted to Aerospace Engineering?

To be eligible for admission, applicants must have, or be in the process of completing, the following:

- A Bachelor's degree in a relevant field such as Aerospace Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Mechatronics, Technical Physics, etc., provided that at least 30 ECTS credits in core engineering subjects (e.g., engineering elements, thermodynamics, fluid dynamics, mechanics) are included in the curriculum.
 OR
- A Diplom-Ingenieur degree (Dipl.-Ing. FH or TU/TH) in Aerospace Engineering, Mechatronics, or another relevant engineering discipline (see above).
- Proof of English proficiency required for all applicants whose first and only native language is <u>not</u>
 English, can be provided through:
 - Completion of a relevant academic degree (as listed above) taught entirely in English or one
 of the following:
 - IELTS Academic, min. 7.0 overall band score 7.0 with no sub-score below 6.5
 - TOEFL, IBT minimum score of 95
 - Cambridge Advanced, Level C1
 - Duolingo English Test: minimum score of 130
 - Note: if an applicant's English proficiency appears insufficient during the interview, the Head of Programme may request the submission of one of the above-mentioned certificates to verify C1-level competence in advanced English.

Schedule

Applications for September 2026 can be submitted starting September 2025

Assessment of applications and admission to the Master's Programme in Aerospace Engineering is conducted on a rolling basis.

Deadline: EU citizens: June 15, 2026; Non-EU citizens: March 31, 2026

Required application documentation

- A curriculum vitae (CV) in English, including a photograph
- Undergraduate degree certificate (Bachelor's or equivalent) including transcript of records and grade point average(GPA)¹. If the degree certificate is not yet available at the time of application, it must be submitted as soon as possible, and no later than 30 June 2026
- Diploma Supplement
- Secondary school leaving certificate
- Birth certificate
- Proof of citizenship (for non-Austrian citizens: copy of passport)
- Proof of English proficiency

In addition, applicants are encouraged to provide any other information that may support the assessment of their qualifications (e.g., work experience, extracurricular activities, research projects, publications, or similar achievements).

¹ Depending on the country of issue, these documents may need to be officially translated into English and legalized. Please refer to the Legalization of Foreign Documents guidelines to verify whether this applies to you. Original documents must be presented prior to matriculation.

Application Procedure - Steps

- 1. Fill in the online application form
- 2. Attach all the required documents (see: Required documents)
- 3. Submit your online application (please note: only complete applications can be evaluated)
- 4. If you require a visa to study in Austria, begin collecting the necessary documentation for your student visa application at this stage. Check with your local Austrian Consulate regarding (1) the specific documents required and (2) the estimated processing time.
- 5. Shortlisted candidates will be invited to a personal interview in English (with the option to conduct the interview online).
- 6. Within two weeks of the interview, you will receive official notification of your admission status (accepted / waitlisted / rejected).
