Erasmus+ Exchange semester - Students and recent graduates (stays from 2 to 12 months)

Grants can only be applied to the physical part of a mobility activity!

<u>Please note:</u> Funding for all mobilities to Erasmus+ programme countries is foreseen but cannot be guaranteed. After the Erasmus+ grant application has been submitted, the budget availability will be checked and only then can an assurance be given regarding the receipt of the Erasmus+ grant as well as the exact grant amount.

Exchange semester in a Programme Country

Top-Up payments

Students and recent graduates with fewer opportunities

Group	Monthly Top-Up in Euro
Students and recent graduates with fewer opportunities	250

This group includes:

- Students with children in need of care who are taken to the place of study/internship.
- Students with disabilities.
- Students with a chronic illness, if this results in increased financial expenses during the stay abroad (compared to the stay in the sending country).

Travel expenses support for environmentally friendly travel

(for all those who do not have their travel expenses reimbursed)

Group	One-time Top Up in Euro
Students opting for environmentally friendly travelling	50

Additional individual support for travel days of up to four days for the outward and return journey is possible.

Inclusion support

If the top-up is not sufficient for students and recent graduates with fewer opportunities, they can apply for inclusion support in case of disability or chronic illness.
